You have the right to:

- Live free from violence, fear and abuse.



- Be protected from harm and from being made to do something you do not want to do.



- Be independent which may involve some risk.



- Say 'no' to anything you do not fully understand.



We want to stop abuse

When someone does bad things to you, that make you feel frightened or unhappy this is called abuse.



Abuse is wrong.

There are six different kinds of abuse:

- verbal abuse



- physical abuse



- discriminatory abuse



- neglect



- sexual abuse



- financial abuse.



They are all wrong and must be stopped.

Tell someone you trust



What to do if you, or someone you know, is being abused:

- tell someone if you think you, or someone you know, is being abused
- phone one of the contact numbers on the back page.
