**NOTICE OF CALL FOR EXPRESSIONS OF INTEREST FOR BIDS FOR  
LEARNING DISABILITY DEVELOPMENT FUND MONIES**

The Learning Disability Partnership Board in Surrey and its 4 Valuing People Groups are seeking bids for learning disability projects. The priorities are:-

- Personalisation
- Supporting people with learning disabilities to live in their own home
- Increasing the number of people with learning disabilities into work
- Reducing Health Inequalities for disabled people

LDDF Bids are for revenue only, not for capital.

Bids can be for Countywide projects or for a local project in a particular locality in Surrey. Bids can be for small scale projects in a particular locality or larger projects County wide. There is no minimum or maximum limit. Bids must meet at least one of the priority areas listed above. In addition bids must represent value for money, demonstrate partnership working and promote the principles of Valuing People: A New Strategy for Learning Disability for the 21<sup>st</sup> Century (2001 White Paper) and Valuing People Now <http://valuingpeople.gov.uk/index.jsp>

LDDF grant is part of the Local Authority Area Based Grant The main purpose of LDDF is to encourage innovation and pilot new ways of working. It is not to support ongoing initiatives. LDDF is one year funding which needs to be completed within timescales.
